## The PLAYCE Policy Project

The PLAYCE Team and our partners are working together to improve the physical activity of children attending Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC). As part of this research we will focus on ECEC policy and practices to increase the physical activity of children attending care. We aim to produce an endorsed 'Early Movement' policy and supporting resources for ECEC. We have conducted focus groups with ECEC staff from 10 centres across WA to gather their feedback on ECEC physical activity policies and practices. We also completed two surveys of a national field of experts across health, physical activity and development in government, non-government and community sectors to gather feedback on the draft ECEC physical activity policy we have developed and factors that will help with the uptake of the policy.

## Masters of Public Health Practicum Students

In August, the PLAYCE Team welcomed two Masters students: Alice Wrobel and Lauren Preedy from UWA to do their practicum with us. During their time Lauren and Alice worked on a number of tasks for the PLAYCE Policy Project, including developing a Resource Guide for ECEC services to help increase physical activity in childcare. They were also actively involved in our stakeholder collaborations with all our partners including Cancer Council WA, Department of Health, Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries, Goodstart Early Learning, Australian Child Care Alliance, Nature Play WA, Colab-Minderoo and researchers from the University of Southern Denmark and Queensland University of Technology.
