The Telethon Kids Institute has created a full-time post-doctoral fellowship position to be based in our Broome office to respond to requests from Aboriginal communities in the Kimberley and other stakeholders for research in the area of improving the social and emotional wellbeing of Aboriginal children and/or young adults in the Kimberley.

Working with Aboriginal communities and other stakeholders, the fellow will develop a program of research that builds the evidence base of what works in the Kimberley to improve the outcomes for Aboriginal children and families.

Fellows will lead, design, conduct and translate relevant research projects, including evaluations. Developing and maintaining strong relationships with stakeholders, including Aboriginal Elders, community members and relevant services is a key component of this work.
