PURPOSE OF POSITION

The Senior Research Officer will:

- Continue to progress a range of research activities in the NHMRC 'Making FASD History in the Pilbara .
- Support the implementation of research, planning and evaluation for the NHMRC-funded Making FASD History Strategy (Pilbara region 2016-2020).
- Work as member of the FASD prevention team with Chief Investigators leading these projects to contribute to the research outcomes outlined in the NHMRC proposal.
- This is an opportunity for a Senior Research Officer experienced in conducting epidemiological and applied research, grant submissions and publications in peer reviewed journals.
- This is a full-time fixed term position for 12months, dependent on performance and continuation of funding.
- Six-month probation period.
- Travel to remote sites will be required, including to remote WA communities.
- Some afterhours work may be required.
- Line management responsibility will be introduced upon appointment.
